FAQS ABOUT EAGLE RIVER ROTARY

Q: What kind of time commitment is involved?

A: Weekly meetings are approximately one hour, but not all members attend every week. Club fundraising and service projects average two-to-three hours per event and participation in three or four events per year is encouraged.

Q: What kind of financial commitment is involved?

A: Weekly meetings cost \$14 for lunch. Club dues are \$50 per calendar quarter. Often, member employers or businesses pay dues and meal costs as a way to be active in the community. Members are also asked to consider a quarterly \$25 donation to the Rotary Foundation.

Q: What's a weekly meeting like?

A: During this time of COVID-19, the Eagle River Rotary Club is meeting online on the 2nd and 4th Mondays of the month via a Zoom link. Once we return to normal in-person meetings, the Eagle River Rotary Club is fairly informal. Lunch is served every Monday at noon at a local restaurant, and members dress casually. The meal is followed at 12:20 by a brief business meeting, and a program starts by 12:30 Program topics range from presentations by local civic or nonprofit groups to individuals with interesting hobbies.

Q: What sets Rotary apart from other service clubs?

A: Each local Rotary club strives to attract members who represent a wide variety of vocations. The organization is known for providing opportunities for business networking, sharing professional

ABOUT THE EAGLE RIVER ROTARY CLUB

Eagle River Rotary was chartered in 1928. Today, the Club has about 40 members who meet every Monday at noon at Chef Rene's at the Eagle River Inn for lunch and a program. A list of members can be found at www.eagleriverrotary.com.

Eagle River Rotary sponsors or participates in several fundraising events annually including its own Wine & Cheese Tasting and the Antique Show & Sale. The Club also assists with food service at a number of local events, participates in an annual Highway Clean-Up, and hosts a water station during the Journey's Marathon. Eagle River Rotary uses proceeds from its fundraising to underwrite local and international humanitarian projects.

Local Club-sponsored projects include improvements to Silver Lake Beach,

contributions to the Dome renovation project, restoration of the downtown Rail Depot, reconstruction of the Kalmar Center and providing substantial grants for additions to the Walter Olson and Edward Demmer Memorial Libraries. New projects are happening throughout the year.

Eagle River Rotary provides annual scholarships to local high school students, and financially assists several area nonprofit groups with projects.

Internationally the Club has participated in building a water well in Haiti, fighting to eradicate Polio, and assisting victims of natural disasters around the world.

The Eagle River Rotary Club has been our area's leading service organization for over 90 years. The Club has initiated or contributed to dozens of meaningful and transformative community projects over the years. The Club continues to fulfill the organization's international motto "Service Above Self" with involvement in over a dozen new and ongoing projects annually.
